The Department for Education has introduced updated statutory guidance for [Relationships, Sex and Health Education \(RSE\)](#), which schools are required to implement from September 2026.

In response, we are reviewing our RSE policy and our wider Personal, Social, Health, Citizenship and Economic (PSHCE) curriculum to ensure our provision is appropriate, inclusive and responsive to meet the needs of all our learners.

In developing our curriculum, we take careful account of each learner's:

- Age and stage of development
- Physical and emotional maturity
- Religious and cultural background
- Special Educational Needs and Disabilities (SEND)
